Local artist explores the Shifting light

The opening of Bronwyn Woodley Graham: shifting light will be the culmination of a remarkable six months for the Tamworth artist.

In October last year, Bronwyn was one of six international artists to take part in Imaginary Journeys, an exhibition at Estense Castle in Ferra, Italy. Since returning home, Bronwyn has been in her Peel Street studio, working towards a solo exhibition in her home town.

"When I visited Bronwyn in her studio to view the work in preparation for this exhibition, I experienced a sense of delight as I was drawn into the atmospheric play of light and tone, through the expressiveness and mood of

colour. There is joyousness in the works; Bronwyn's love of what she is doing is evident in her work," commented Sandra McMahon.

Bronwyn has a distinctive style of painting where watercolour techniques used with oil paints create lightness, fluency and ephemeral atmospheric effects. Bronwyn's works provide the viewer with just enough of a landscape to suggest scale, orientation, weather conditions and distance. "In all my work, my goal is to remain truthful in my response to a subject. From this response I like to draw out a type of mystical quality from a scene, allowing room for imagination to create its own reality. In

this way the viewer can make their own connection with the painting in a very personal way," said Bronwyn.

The exhibition will be opened by Arts North West's recently appointed Regional Arts Development Officer Jane Kreis, on Friday, February 26 at 6.00pm.

Bronwyn Woodley Graham: shifting light will be open from Saturday, February 27 through to Thursday, April 1, 2010.
