IT WAS a celebration of light and the art it inspires at Tamworth Regional Gallery on Friday evening.

Tamworth artist Bronwyn Woodley Graham opened her latest exhibition *Shifting Light* with art lovers flocking to enjoy the fruits of her talent.

Mrs Woodley Graham said most of her inspiration came from light and the way it played upon and within subjects.

"I love the journey and beauty found in trying to capture the energy and atmosphere of my subject. It can be turbulent and moody, peaceful and contemplative, or ethereal and intangible," she said.
